

Everyone has a vocation or calling. For some the calling is marriage, for others it is the single life and still for others it is religious life. Each is a way to live out our Baptismal call sharing our gifts in service to God and others. We are available to walk with you as you discern whether religious life might be a life-giving choice for you.

As a young woman Katharina Kasper urged by the voice of the Spirit responded to the social needs of her village in Dernbach, Germany. In 1851 she founded the congregation of the Poor Handmaids of Jesus Christ. In 1868 Poor Handmaids arrived in America to address the needs of the German immigrants. Today, a century and a half later, we find Poor Handmaids still ministering in education and in caring for the health, social and spiritual needs of the vulnerable and underserved with particular attention to women and children.

Poor Handmaids are an international congregation of 500+ Sisters and 120+ women in formation in nine countries on five continents living and ministering in the spirit of Saint Katharina Kasper.


